

POLLUTION AND WASTE





Farmers use pesticides to protect crops and fertilizers to improve yields, but irrigation water carries these chemicals to groundwater or rivers where they contaminate our water supply.



We generate lots of waste where we live – plastic bottles, packaging, batteries, sewage, used oils and household chemicals.



Mining companies must store their waste safely and are monitored by the authorities, but in accidents and natural disasters, pollutants may leak into local rivers.
